### [Name] recites the following:

Eloheinu v'Elohei avoteinu ve-imoteinu

Our God, and God of our ancestors, we stand here tonight on this threshold in time, in this moment of transition between Shabbat and weekday, to mark and sanctify my own journey of transition; to declare that my place in Your covenant has neither changed nor wavered, only that the name by which I am called to Your covenant and my community shall be changed from this day forward.

Today, before my God and my people, and in the embrace of my family and friends, I set aside my former name and take on the mantle of a new name, one befitting the person I am becoming, Jewish and nonbinary, bound in covenant to my heritage, and free and true in my personhood.

#### The havdalah candle is lit

Keep them from every harm and suffering, and near to joy and fulfillment. May their family and community merit to teach and to learn from them. May the deeds of their hands be faithful to God, and their heart be a heart of wisdom. And let us say: Amen.
